Sample Prompt 1

Lesson-plan generator — CBSE Class 7 Science

Plug your subject, class and chapter into this prompt. You get back a printable 45-minute plan with objectives, activities, exit-ticket and homework.

Use case: **Saves ~90 minutes per lesson plan.**

The prompt:

Act as an experienced Indian school teacher. Create a 45-minute lesson plan for CBSE Class 7 Science, Chapter "Heat - Conduction, Convection and Radiation". Sample Prompt 3

Sample Prompt 4

Sample Prompt 5
